CDC Laurels ICMR Scholarship 2010-2011



The Indian Council of Medical Research, New Delhi, organizes a nationwide short-term scholarship programme annually for undergraduate medical and dental students, to generate interest in the field of research. Upon completion, scholarship certificate and stipend are awarded to deserving participants.

Of the nearly 30 students, from CDC, which applied for STS 2010, 5 research proposals were approved by the council. The selected students (Dr. Suja George, Dr. Preethi Ann Koshy, Akula Sunil Kumar, Vijay Alageshan and Tulika Diwan) also attended a workshop on 'Clinical and Laboratory Medicine Research' sponsored by the ICMR and organised by the Moving Academy of Medicine and Biomedicine, Pune. It was held at the Institute of Pathology, Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi from July 12th to 14th 2010.

Project reports that were awarded with a certificate of accreditation and a sum of Rs. 10,000 were:

- Visibility of anterior toeth at rest- an evaluation (Dr. Suja George, under the guidance of Dr. Angleena Daniel)
- 'Clinical comparison of the efficacy of the conventional inferior alveolar nerve block and the modified approach' (Dr. Preethi Ann Koshy, under the guidance of Dr. Manisha Chauhan)
- 'Recognising and assessing the fear of dental pain and anxiety' (Tulika Diwan, under the guidance of Dr. Inderjot Singh).



14th & 15th May 2011

Dental rehabilitation of patients with special needs-A team approach

The programme, held in the Hospital Auditorium, was designed to provide insight into evaluation of systematic treatment planning and scientific decision making of



dentofacial deformities, especially cleft patients, and to discuss inter-disciplinary treatment modalities. Lectures were delivered on topics such as dental arch preparation for alveolar bone grafting, surgical prediction tracing, splint fabrication for Orthognathic surgery and Distraction Osteogenesis. Dr. Sherry Peter and Dr. Puneet Batra gave guest lectures. The seminar was followed by a demonstration and hands-on workshops on Naso-Alveolar Modelling and Surgical Treatment Planning.

6th August 2011

An engaging session on the management of dentin hypersensitivity, sponsored by Colgate, was organised to introduce Colgate's new Pro-Argin Technology. Dr. Kapil Dua and Dr. Ritu Jain enlightened the gathering on Dentin Hypersensitivity prevalence, Diagnosis and Modes of management.
