As part of its oral health mission program, CDC organized a dental camp on the occasion of World Health Day on 7th April. This remarkable

feat comprised of various informative models on basic oral hygiene, videos and poster presentations on general awareness regarding brushing habits, ill effects of tobacco use, dental flossing and other useful topics. Pamphlets in Hindi and English, addressing oral problems and treatment modalities were distributed. Around a hundred

patients turned up to avail the facility of free dental checkup. Under the guidance of Dr. Ritu Jain and Dr. Amandeep Pabla, referral cards were made for the patients and treatment was provided at subsidized rates within the college.

> society in Ludhiana. Yajur Verma, (CR batch of 2011) was the mastermind behind this innovative outreach and managed to loop in Major Hosiery mills such as Nahar, Oswal and Monte Carlo for this project, each having an average of over 2000 employees. Multiple camps were set up for free oral hygiene evaluation and referral in these locations. The results

have been phenomenal! 1185 individuals were examined and referred within 7 months. The best quality of dental treatment is being provided to them at subsidized rates. A continued pursuit of this service is intended in the coming years to impact a target population of nearly 10,000 workers.




