IN REMEMBERANCE OF DR. SHANE SAM MATHEW

A goofy, infectious smile, the rare ability to laugh in the midst of adversities and find humour in trying circumstances. This was Dr. Shane Sam Mathew, a beloved son, brother and a wonderful friend to many. Dr. Shane belonged to the batch of 2010- Asclepians. He graduated in the year 2015 and went on to serve at TLM Chandkhuri Leprosy Hospital, Bilaspur for his service obligation.

When the need arose for a dentist to replace Dr. Jhurgen Cazso in Liberia, he rose to meet it gladly and with faith that God would be his guide. On the night of September 3rd, 2017, Dr. Shane Sam Mathew lost his life in a tragic fire accident.

Following are excerpts from a few tributes written by his batch mates who loved him dearly:

"He was like the wind, no one knew where he'd come from or where he'd plan to go next. If there was anyone in the batch who could elevate the stressful mood, it would have to be Shane. His presence in classroom meant laughter and giggles".

"His smile could cure my grief and put a smile on my face. The most charming guy in our batch who shared a special bond with each one of us and taught us to be happy regardless of our situations. I thank God for Shane's life, the blessing he was to us and the people he served in the mission field".

Dr. Shane's life will be forever cherished, he will be fondly remembered and will remain an inspiration to many.
