ICMR Short Term Scholarship Project (STS)

The Indian Council of Medical Research offers a Short Term Scholarship to students interested in learning the research methodology. The proposal has to be submitted by the month of February and if accepted, the project has to be carried over a period of two months and the report should be submitted in one month's time. It is required that the area of research be prudently selected with adequate clinical relevance. The student is entitled to a scholarship sum of rupees five thousand and is awarded a Certificate of Accomplishment from ICMR.

It is a matter of great pride that one such project has been done by Anish Varkey John (Batch of 2005) entitled Effect of Non Surgical Periodontal Therapy on glycemic control in Type-II Diabetes. Infact it is the first STS project (approved) by a dental student in Punjab.
